Purpose of the Trust Fund Scholarship

To support and celebrate graduating high school students who have been and are active in the mission and ministry of Our Saviors Lutheran Church (OSLC). To support and celebrate students seeking advanced graduate training for ministry or profession as a church worker in the ELCA or a full communion partner. This scholarship is administered by the Trust Fund Committee of Our Savior's Lutheran Church. It is supported through member donations and investments.

OSLC Trust Fund Scholarship is for applicants graduating high school and moving on to post secondary education, including vocational training, military, public service certifications and other training. This is a one time scholarship award and applicants must be members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church (OSLC), Oconomowoc, WI.

Scholarship Award Amount

The 2024 Trust Fund Scholarship Award for graduating high school students is \$500.00.

Graduating High School Student - Scholarship Criteria

High School award criteria is based on involvement in ministry and mission of OSLC. If the student has joined OSLC during high school, please include any previous church involvement along with providing a phone reference from the previous congregational pastor. If you have questions about previous church membership and how to include that in the application, please contact Bethany Kurschner at bethany.kurschner@oslc-wi.org.

In addition to completing the application form, students will be asked to complete a brief 20 minute interview with members of the scholarship team. The interview will be conducted in person or on zoom/virtual. Interview questions are included below for your preparation.

Engagement in baptismal promises/confirmation vows is the organizing structure of the application and criteria for award. The vows are as follows:

To live among God's faithful people

To hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper

To share the good news of Christ in word and deed

To serve others, following the example of Jesus

To strive for justice and peace in all the earth

Criteria for a Successful Award

- a. Complete all the parts of the application by the deadline.
- b. Planned enrollment/attendance in post secondary education, including vocational training, military, public service certifications and other training.
- c. Verification of enrollment or registration to program, college or training submitted by June 15, 2024 to Bethany Kurschner at bethany.kurschner@oslc-wi.org
- d. Participation in the ministry and mission of OSLC.
- e. Communicate a plan for growing in faith.
- f. Complete an interview with the scholarship team.

2024 Scholarship Application and Award Timeline for Graduating High School Students

Completed Scholarship Applications are due on April 1, 2024.

Students will be notified on April 3 of the interview schedule.

Interviews will take place between April 8 and April 24.

Students will be notified of awards by April 30.

Students will be recognized on May 19 at the 10:30 am worship service.

Deadline for Verification of program enrollment or registration, June 15,2024.

Scholarships will be awarded by August 15, 2024 (unless notified by the scholarship team of a different date).

- 4. From the Bible passage you selected for the application: What catches your attention or stands out to you in the passage? How did this become an important passage to you?
- 5. If you were giving advice to yourself when you were confirmed (thinking back to confirmation and the end of 8th grade) what would you tell your younger self?
- 6. Imagine it is a year from now, how do you think your faith will grow? How would you like it to grow? How will you connect with a church/faith community next year what first steps might you take?
